The \$5 admission charge will allow children to visit each exhibitor, and they will be able to enter the museum at no cost.

May 28 will be the fourth annual Touch a Truck event. Vehicles expected include a fire truck, a school bus, and a mobile production truck. In addition to "touching" each vehicle, children will have the opportunity to climb inside, speak with the driver, and learn about the vehicle's use. Lunch will be available to purchase, as Harvey's will be onsite flipping burgers. Proceeds from this event will support the initiatives of the Canadian Canoe Museum.

"As children, I think we all have a small fascination with big trucks," says Jamie Seabrook, who is planning to bring a truck for the fourth time. "This event allows children to experience the lights and sounds of the truck, and they are able to discover what it feels like to sit behind the wheel. Kids will be able to see everything from dump trucks, fire trucks and police vehicles to cement mixers, a mobile production van, and a Zamboni. They will be able to explore all this in one place, and they can visit the museum's exhibits for free!"
