The Team Leader position plays important role in orientation, supervision and daily operations of interpretive staff at museum. Leaders also provide guided tours, visitor orientation, retail duties, exhibits and site maintenance. Training in heritage artisan skills will be provided. A background interest in Canadian heritage is vital. Existing talents or experience in crafts/woodwork are an asset. Proficiency in French preferred.

- Possess a strong interest in leadership skills development
- Have completed or be working on a post-secondary degree or diploma in the following fields of study: Heritage Interpretation, Canadian Studies, History, Museum studies, Indigenous Studies, Anthropology, Environmental Sciences, Tourism, Education or a related field.
- Have a working knowledge of Canadian history, and an appreciation of Canada's cultural diversity.

- Fluency in English is essential; fluency in French is considered an asset.
