Touch-A-Truck returns at The Canadian Canoe Museum: May 26

PETERBOROUGH, Thursday, May 9, 2019 — Touch-A-Truck, a family event that encourages children of all ages to explore different modes of transportation, returns at The Canadian Canoe Museum on May 26 from 9:30 am until 2:30 pm. Since the sounds are sometimes loud, between 1 and 2 pm will be horn and siren-free.

This event, in its sixth year, sees the parking lot at 910 Monaghan Road brimming with vehicles, from an ambulance to a zamboni – and everything in between. Children are encouraged to climb aboard the vehicles, and then explore some special activities inside the museum.

“At this event, children have the opportunity to get up close to vehicles they may typically only get to see from a distance,” says Karen Taylor, Director of Programs. “While we work with children to explore watercraft and their stories everyday at the museum, Touch-A-Truck allows us to take a broader look at transportation. It’s a fun, family event and definitely one of our most popular.”

Admission for the event is \$5 per person (for those 2 years of age and older), which includes admission to the museum. Funds raised will support museum programming.
