### FEES

- \$40/participant (6pm-8:30am)
- Minimum payment \$600 for up to 15 children
- adult admissions included at 1:5 ratio (ages 5-7), 1:8 (ages 8+)
- additional adult \$15/each
- payment due on day of your visit
- no additional taxes
- add-on morning program @\$5/participant
